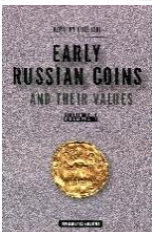

CANADA CELEBRATES ARTIST

Canada celebrated indigenous artist Daphne Odjig with both colored and uncolored 2 Dollar coins in 2025. The design is based on her 1977 painting "Folk Singer". According to the National Gallery of Canada, "Odjig's work is defined by curving contours, strong outlining, overlapping shapes and an unsurpassed sense of color". This is clearly shown in the color version of the coin. An adaptation of her drawing of a fisher from her "The Indian in Transition" is on the outer ring along with latent images of maple leaves. King Charles III is on the obverse.

CANADA'S TOMB OF THE UNKNOWN SOLDIER



Canada featured their Tomb of the Unknown Soldier on colored and uncolored 2 Dollar coins in 2025. The tomb, located in front of the National War Museum in Ottawa holds the remains of an unidentified Canadian soldier who died in France in World

War I. The tomb honors all Canadians who died in combat. Behind the tomb are the silhouettes of four sentries representing all Canadians. In front is a poppy. The poppy is red in the colored version of the coin. King Charles III is on the obverse.

CANADA HONORS 30th ANNIVERSARY OF 2 DOLLAR COIN ON 2 DOLLAR COIN



Canada celebrated the 30th Anniversary of their 2 Dollar coin, known as a Toonie with a non-circulating commemorative 2 Dollar coin. The design is similar to the regular 2 dollar coin, however the double dates 1996-2026 appear above the bust of King Charles III and the "W" mintmark for the Winnipeg mint is below the bust. The standard polar bear design is used on the reverse.

CROATIA COMMEMORATES 1,100th ANNIVERSARY

Croatia commemorated the 1,100th Anniversary of the coronation of King Tomislav in 925 on this 2025 2 Euro coin. The coronation of the king is considered the founding of Croatia as a nation. It is unclear exactly when, where and by whom he was crowned. The coin depicts the statue of King Tomislav on horseback against a checkered background. The statue is located in front of Zagreb's main train station.

GREECE CELEBRATES WOMAN ADMIRAL WITH 2025 2 EURO



Greece commemorated the 200th anniversary of the death of Laskarina Bouboulina on this 2025 2 Euro coin. Bouboulina and her private navy was instrumental in Greece gaining independence from the Ottoman Empire in 1821. She was widowed twice, inheriting a considerable sum of money from her second husband. Using her fortune, she assembled and built a fleet which she commanded during the Greek war of Independence and formed a private army. Her reputation as a successful commander spread throughout Europe. She found herself on the wrong side in the Greek Civil War of 1824. She was imprisoned on false charges of witchcraft and heresy by her opponents before eventually being released. In 1825 she was murdered in a family feud over her son's choice of a bride. The coin depicts Bouboulina aboard a ship.

GREECE HONORS COMPOSER ON 2025 2 EURO

Composer and lyricist Mikis Theodorakis is featured on this 2025 Greek 2 Euro commemorating the 100th anniversary of his birth. Theodorakis is credited with over 1000 works including the scores of *Zorba the Greek* and *Serpico*. In addition to being a composer, he was involved in politics and served multiple terms in the Greek Parliament. The features Theodorakis conducting an orchestra and a musical staff.

CHINA CELEBRATES WORLD WAR II VICTORY

China issued this circulating commemorative 2025 bi-metallic 10 Yuan coin to commemorate the "80th Anniversary of the Victory in the Chinese People's War of Resistance Against Japanese Aggression and the World Anti-Fascist War" or what is commonly called World War II. The coin depicts a portion of the Great Wall of China with the numeral "80" on a guard tower. Below are the dates 1945-2025. The emblem of the People's Republic of China is on the obverse.

MULTI-COLORED CHINESE 2024 & 2025 PEKING OPERA 5 YUAN COINS



China continued their series of partially colored 5 Yuan commemorating the "Art of Peking Chinese Opera". The 2024 issue depicts a Dangjiao character. The Dangjiao is a

lively, vivacious young woman. The 2025 coin depicts a LaoSheng character. The LaoSheng is a dignified older role, usually distinguished by a long, thin beard. They are two of the main categories of characters in Peking Chinese Opera. Peking Chinese opera combines music, singing, mime, dance and acrobatics with elaborate, colorful costumes on a sparse stage. The obverse features musical instruments and the emblem of the People's Republic of China. The 30mm coins are struck in a brass alloy.

FINLAND 2 EURO CELEBRATES ATHLETIC COMPETITION

Finland issued this 2025 2 Euro coin to celebrate the 100th anniversary of the Finland-Sweden Athletics Match. In Finland, it is called Ruotsi-ottelu (The Sweden Match). In Sweden it is called Finnkampen (The Finland Match). It is an annual track and field event between Finland and Sweden that draws large, enthusiastic audiences. Nations are judged on their overall score in the competition. Points are awarded for each finishing position, so that a coming in 5th rather than 6th can decide the winning nation and associated bragging rights.

GERMAN 2025 REUNIFICATION COMMEMORATIVE 2 EURO



Germany commemorated the 35th Anniversary of its reunification with this 2025 dated 2 Euro coin. The coin features the legend "35 Jahre Deutsche Einheit Wir Sind Ein Volk" (35 Years of German Unity We Are One People) broken into two parts, representing the Berlin Wall that divided the nation. The connecting "D" in the center stands for Deutschland, as does the "D" at the bottom of the coin. The designers initials and the mintmark (A=Berlin, D=Munich, F=Stuttgart, G=Karlsruhe, J=Hamburg) is at the top of the coin.

LOW MINTAGE COLOR BATTLE OF BRITAIN COMMEMORATIVE

Solomon Islands issued this 2025 multi-color Proof-like 50 Cents to commemorate the 85th Anniversary of the Battle of Britain. The 28.5mm, seven-sided, silver-plated coin depicts a multi-color Spitfire and bears the legend "SO MUCH OWED BY SO MANY TO SO FEW". King Charles III is on the obverse. The coin has a mintage of only 499 pieces and comes in a presentation card.

LOW MINTAGE ISLE OF MAN GOLD ANGEL



This Isle of Man 2025 1/2 Gram (1/64 troy ounce) gold Angel is a diminutive option in the Isle of Man Angel series.

The design is based original English Angel coin first minted in 1465 featuring Archangel Michael killing a dragon. The obverse depicts King Charles III. The 11mm coin was minted by The Tower Mint in .9999 fine gold and has a mintage of only 1000 pieces.

GOLD COINS FROM CHAD

These thin, small gold coins from the African nation of Chad feature African wildlife. The 16mm coins contain 1/1000 troy ounce of .999 fine gold and have a face value of 3000 CFA Francs. One coin features a lion, the other depicts a leopard. The Chad coat of arms is on the obverse. The undated coins come in a colorful protective card.

HISTORIC COINS

ANCIENT CHINESE SPADE COIN

This square foot spade coin was minted by the State of Yan between about 350 and 250BC, during China's Warring States Period. Yan was the most north-eastern of the major states. For much of its history the capital was at Ji, in what is now Beijing. Faced with threats from nomadic tribes from the north it constructed early segments of what became the Great Wall of China. Spade coins were shaped like a spade or weeding tool, but are too small and thin to have any purpose other than their use as money. These "An Yang" style copper spade coins are about 45mm x 25mm. The coins show minimal wear, but are a bit crusty having been buried for over 2000 years.

COIN OF INFAMOUS ROMAN EMPEROR NERO



Though it is probably apocryphal that Nero "fiddled while Rome burned", we do know he was a lover of the arts and sports; and he was famous for his debaucheries, political murders, and the persecution of Christians. He became Emperor at age 17 in 54AD upon the poisoning death of Emperor Claudius. It is believed that he poisoned his step-brother Britannicus, had his mother Agrippina murdered, executed his first wife Claudia after divorcing her, and kicked his second wife Poppea to death. He carried on an affair with Statilia

Messalina, and then forced her husband to commit suicide so he could marry her. He ordered a young man named Sporus to be castrated, so he could marry him as well. He is rumored to have Christians dipped in oil and set on fire to provide light in his garden at night. Many others, including Saint Peter, were crucified. As his reign progressed, the treasury became depleted due to his excessive spending on palaces and public buildings. Executions increased and Nero devoted more and more of his time to sports, music festivals and orgies. The Senate and the leader of the Praetorian Guard turned eventually against him and his excesses. Hearing that the Senate condemned him to be beaten to death, he committed suicide in 68AD. Nero is pictured this debased silver tetradrachm struck in Alexandria, Egypt. At the time Egypt was under Roman control. The coin is approximately 24mm in diameter. It is an important artifact of one of Rome's most infamous emperors.

BYZANTINE CHRIST FOLLIS

Though Byzantine coins typically portrayed the emperor, during the period between about 969 to 1092AD Jesus Christ was featured on the coins rather than the emperor. By placing Jesus on the coin rather than the emperor they indicated that the emperor is subservant to Christ. The most common reverses have either a four-line legend "IHSUS XRISTUS BASILEU BASILE" (Jesus Christ King of King) or a two line legend "IC XC and NI- KA (May Jesus Christ Conquer) divided by a cross. Many are overstruck on earlier coins, which blurs the design.

SILVER DIRHAM OF YOUNG SULTAN OF THE SELJUQS OF RUM



The Seljuqs of Rum ruled the central part of what is now Turkey from 1077 to 1308. The area was formerly Byzantine territory. The name Rum is derived from Rome and referred to the territory of the Eastern Roman Empire. By the mid 13th century The Seljuqs of Rum had become a vassal of the Ilkhanate Mongols. Kaykhusraw III became the Sultan of Rum in 1265 when he was six or

younger after the Ilkhanates had his father executed. He was little more than a figurehead, with the government run by regents and viziers. Toward the end of his reign Rum was wracked by revolts and invasions. In 1282 he took part in an unsuccessful revolt against the Ilkhanates and was executed by the Ilkhanates in 1284. Following his death the Sultanate collapsed in a series of revolts and internal power struggles, resulting in the execution of the last Sultan of Rum in 1308. The silver Dirhams of Kaykhusraw III have the sultan's seal on one side. The other side has an inscription that proclaims "*The Sultan, the greatest, The helpers of this world and the hereafter, The father of the Faith*". The coins show little wear but have weak areas from being hand struck.

NAPOLEONIC WARS COIN FROM JAVA

This copper 1 Duit from Java dates between 1807 and 1809. It is a most unusual issue. The coin was minted for a French colony and featured the emblem of a Dutch company that no longer existed. At the time Java was a French colony, as The Netherlands and its colonies had been taken over by the French and were ruled Napoleon's brother. The simple, crude, locally minted coin has the denomination and date on one side and the VOC emblem of the Dutch East India Company on the other. The Dutch East India Company declared bankruptcy and was dissolved in 1799, with the Dutch government taking over its colonies. The company had suffered major losses in the fourth Anglo-Dutch War, faced increasing competition, and was weighed down by growing administrative costs and corruption. Even though the company no longer existed, the continued use of VOC emblem helped assure local acceptance of the coins as they were similar to the coins that had been in circulation for generations. Dutch authorities may have also wanted to represent a continued Dutch colonial presence, even though the country was ruled by the French.

RUSSIAN CZAR ALEXANDER I FOUGHT NAPOLEON



Alexander I, "The Blessed" became Czar of Russia at age 23 upon the assassination of his father in 1801. Many believe he was in on the plot. The first part of his reign was dominated by the Napoleonic Wars. He changed his position toward France four times. In 1812 Napoleon began his disastrous invasion of Russia. The Russians employed a scorched earth strategic retreat and guerilla warfare. Disease, starvation and the Russian winter took their toll on

Napoleon's army. Of the over 600,000 troops that entered Russia, only about 100,000 returned alive. During the later part of his reign Alexander became increasingly conservative and reactionary. He ended many of his earlier reforms. Schools were purged of foreign teachers and education became more religiously driven and politically conservative. He died of typhus in 1825. Despite being married at age 15, he left no legitimate heirs. Neither of his brothers wanted to become czar. After a period of confusion and an attempted coup, his brother Nicholas agreed to become czar. These copper 1 Kopec coins are dated from 1811 to 1825 It features the Russian arms and date on one side and the denomination and mintmark withing a wreath on the other.

SILVER 5 FRANC OF NAPOLEON III



Napoleon III, the nephew of Napoleon I, was elected President of France in 1848 after the overthrow of King Louis-Phillipe. In 1851 he declared himself Emperor and tried to resurrect the grandeur of the original Napoleonic era. He modernized the French economy, farming and industry, commissioned a grand reconstruction of Paris, promoted

building the Suez Canal and expanded the French colonial empire. In 1870 he made the mistake of declaring war on Prussia. After France's crushing defeat he was driven from power and went into exile in England. The silver 5 Franc of Napoleon III depicts the emperor on the obverse and the arms of France's Second Empire on the reverse. The 37mm coin contains .7234 troy ounces of silver and dates between 1867 and 1870.

NEW BRUNSWICK CENT

Prior to joining the Dominion of Canada in 1867, New Brunswick was a separate British colony with its own coinage. The New Brunswick 1 Cent depicts a bare headed Queen Victoria on the obverse and a crown within a wreath of leaves and flowers on the reverse. The 25mm bronze coin was issued only two years: 1861 and 1864.

RUNNING GOD ON COIN OF DHAR



Dhar was a Princely State in central India with an area of about 1800 square miles (4,660 km²). In the late 19th century it issued these crude copper 1 Paisa coins depicting the Hindu deity Hanuman running holding a banner. The coin bears the nominal date of AH1289 (1872AD) but was struck for many years with many different varieties. The coins were widely used in the opium trade in the Malwa region. Hanuman is monkey-like being that noted for his great strength, loyalty and devotion to Rama. He is sometime depicted as the patron deity of martial arts, meditation, and scholarly pursuits.

1/2 CENT OF THE WHITE RAJAH OF SARAWAK



Sarawak was a privately-owned nation ruled by the Brooke family. The Sultan of Brunei awarded it to the English adventurer James Brooke in 1841 for his help in putting down a rebellion, thus he became the first "White Rajah" of Sarawak. The throne eventually passed down to his grand-nephew Charles Vynar Brooke in 1917, In 1933 Charles issued this bronze 1/2 Cent bearing his portrait.

The 18mm coin was struck at the Heaton Mint in England for only a single year. Due to the heavy destruction the country suffered during World War II, Charles ceded the country to Great Britain in 1946. It is now part of Malaysia. This is a scarce, high-grade coin issued by an English family that controlled an entire Asian nation. The coin is technically Uncirculated but may have spots or toning, so we call them AU-UNC.

SQUARE CENT OF MALAYA & BRITISH BORNEO



Malaya and British Borneo was a currency union for the British colonies and protectorates of Malaya, Singapore, British North Borneo, Sarawak and Brunei that lasted from 1953 until 1967, when the countries started to issue their own coins. It issued its first 1 cent coin in 1956. The square bronze coin depicted Queen Elizabeth on the obverse and the denomination and date on the reverse.

LAST SILVER QUARTER RUPEES FROM MAURITIUS



The Mauritius 1938 Quarter Rupee was struck only that single year. The 19mm is struck in .916 fine silver and contains .086 troy ounces of silver. The crowned head of King George VI is on the obverse. The reverse reflects Mauritius' heritage. At the top is the British crown. To the left is a stylized lotus flower, representing Indian influence. About 70% of Mauritius'

population has Indian ancestry. Below is a Fleur-de-lis, representing the French influence. France controlled Mauritius for almost a century until British took control in the Napoleonic Wars. French still is widely spoken. To the left is a Tudor Rose, representing the English influence. Following World War II and the lowering of the silver content of the Indian Rupee, Mauritius again issued the 1/4 Rupee with the same design, however the silver content was reduced to .500 fine with a silver content of .0469 troy ounces. That coin was struck only a single year: 1946. It was the last silver 1/4 Rupee issued by Mauritius.

OLD BU FIJI COIN SET

This set features the first coins for Queen Elizabeth from the Pacific island nation of Fiji in Brilliant Uncirculated condition. The copper-nickel Half-Penny and Penny are dated 1954 and have a center hole. The Half-Penny was struck only that single year before it was discontinued. The twelve-sided 1955 brass three Pence features a native hut on one side and Queen Elizabeth on the other.

OLD UNCIRCULATED ARGENTINA COIN SET



This five coin set from Argentina includes the 1, 2, 5, 10 and 20 Centavos dating between 1948 and 1955. The

copper 1948 1 Centavo and 1949 2 Centavos have the Argentine coat of arms on the obverse and the denomination on the reverse. The 1956 5 Centavos, 1953 10 Centavos and 1955 20 Centavos are struck in clad-steel. They feature Jose de San Martin on one side and the denomination and date on the other. San Martin was an Argentine General who liberated Argentina, Peru and Chile from Spanish rule. He led his army in a daring crossing of the Andes leading to the liberation of Chile. Following his successful military exploits he resigned his military command, excluded himself from politics and moved to Europe. The coins are Uncirculated, though the 1 and 2 Centavos may have minor spotting.

HIGH-GRADE 72 YEAR OLD PERUVIAN COIN SET



This seven coin set from Peru includes the 1 Centavos to the 1 Sol de Oro dating between 1952 to 1954. The zinc 1 and 2 Centavos depict the sun as a six-pointed star on one side and the denomination surrounded by two cornucopias. The brass 5, 10, and 20 Centavos have the head of Ceres on the obverse and the denomination on the other.

The 1/2 and 1 Sol de Oro have inscriptions on one side and the Peruvian coat of arms on the other. Though called a Sol de Oro, which means Sun of Gold, the coin is made of brass. The coins are technically Uncirculated, however, many are toned or have spots, so we call them AU-Unc.

POLAND 1987 MINT SET

This packaged set includes the Poland 50 Groszy, 1, 5, 10 and 20 Zlotych dated 1987. The coins all have similar designs with the uncrowned Polish Eagle on one side and the denomination on the other. The set was issued during a time of increasing popular unrest in Poland. The standard of living for most Poles was falling and there were shortages of many basic necessities. Though the communist government implemented martial law and outlawed the Solidarity labor movement, opposition to the government continued to grow. In 1989 the communist government of Poland collapsed after an unexpectedly poor showing by government sponsored candidates in a highly restricted election.

UGANDA 1998 COIN SET FEATURE NATIVE WILDLIFE



In 1998 Uganda introduced four new coins featuring native wildlife. The thick, brass 500 Shillings features an East African

crowned crane. The 200 Shillings shows a Cichlid fish. An African Bull is on the 100 Shillings and an antelope is on the 50 Shillings. The obverses of all the coins depict the Ugandan coat of arms which features a Ugandan Kob (a type of antelope) and a Crested crane supporting a shield and spears.

TROUBLE IN IRAN

Prior to the Islamic Republic, Iran was a kingdom ruled by Shah Mohammad Reza Pahlavi. This 5 coin set of the Shah includes the 10 Rials depicting the Shaw and the 5, 2, 1 Rial and 50 Dinar



featuring the Radiant Lion arms of Iran on the obverse and the denomination on the reverse. The coins may be weakly struck or have minor mint errors. In 1979 the Shah was overthrown and the Islamic Republic of Iran was established. One of its first coins was a commemorative 1 Rial



dated SH1359 (AD1980) depicting the Dome of the Rock or Qubbet el-Sakhra - which is located in Jerusalem, Israel! The coin was struck to express solidarity with Palestine and oppose Israel's control of Jerusalem. The denomination and date in Persian is on the



obverse of the 20mm aluminum-bronze clad steel coin. In 1981 Iran issued a 20 Rials commemorating the third anniversary of the establishment of the Islamic Republic. The copper-nickel coin features a traditional Persian design of stylized tulips. Due to inflation, 1992 Iran introduced a bi-metallic 250 Rials in 1992 depicting a stylized Grenadine blossom. The other side includes the denomination and date. It is dated between 1373 and 1375 in the Solar Hijri calendar which corresponds to 1994 to 1996AD.

ISLAMIC REPUBLIC OF IRAN COIN SET



This three coin set includes the 100, 250 and 500 Rials issued by the Islamic Republic of Iran in 2006. The coins are dated 1385 in Iran's Solar Hijri (SH) calendar. The aluminum-bronze 100 Rials depicts the Iman Reza Shrine. It is the third largest mosque in the

world and one of Shia Islam's holiest sites. The 250 Rials has the same design as the previous bi-metallic 250 Rials but is smaller (24.6mm) and is struck in copper-nickel. Due to inflation the 100 and 250 Rials were discontinued in 2006. The bi-metallic 500 Rials features a traditional Persian design portraying a stylized bird and flower. The obverses of all the coins include the denomination and date in Persian.

WORLD WAR II

WORLD WAR II JAPANESE MILITARY CURRENCY FOR HONG KONG

Japan issued this 100 Yen note for use in Hong Kong in the closing months of World War II. It was the highest denomination military currency issued by Japan. The note utilized the basic design of the 1944 Japanese homeland 100 Yen note, however with modified legends on the back and the front has an overprint that translates as "Military Currency". The note pictures the Yumedono Pavilion, or Hall of Dreams. It was constructed in 739 as a monument to the semi-legendary Prince Shotoku Taishi on the site of the prince's palace. The prince is pictured to the right within a green circle. Because civilians were forced to accept the unbacked Military Yen it cost the Japanese government virtually nothing to purchase whatever they wanted. The note large sized note is 163 x 94mm and is Uncirculated.

NAZI GERMAN MILITARY CURRENCY



Wehrmacht military currency was used by Nazi Germany to pay its troops during the final months of World War II. The notes are dated September 15, 1944. Soldiers were paid in

military scrip while in transit. When a soldier arrived at his post the notes could be converted to the local currency or occupation notes. The notes all have similar designs. The front includes a small Eagle holding a Swastika and the inscription "VERRECHNUNGSSCHEIN FÜR DIE DEUTSCHE WEHRMACHT" (Clearing notes for German Armed Forces) The back of the note includes regulations and instructions on how to use the notes. They are an interesting and historic pieces of World War II military history.

EMERGENCY WWII REICHSBANK NOTE

This German 20 Reichsmark note was issued by the German Reichsbank in Sudetenland and Lower



Silesia at the very end of World War II. Sudetenland and Lower Silesia were areas of Czechoslovakia and Poland had been forcibly incorporated into Germany at the start of World War II. Because of the advancing allied armies, shipments of regular Germany currency were no longer available from Berlin. The note is dated April 28, 1945, less than two weeks before Germany surrendered. The tan and brown note is 150 x 80mm.

HITLER'S CHURCH ON NAZI SILVER 5 REICHSMARK

Adolf Hitler and the Nazi party took formal control of Germany at a ceremony held at the Potsdam Garrison Church on March 21, 1933. The event is commemorated on this silver 5 Reichsmark depicting the Church. The other side depicts a Germanic Eagle and two small swastikas. The church was destroyed by fire on April 14, 1945. The 29mm coin is struck in .900 fine silver, contains .4016 troy ounces of silver and has a lettered edge. It was struck for only two years: 1934 and 1935.

NAZI OCCUPATION CURRENCY



In order to control inflation and limit currency flows, a special currency, called Reichskreditkassenschein was used in the nations overrun by Hitler's forces. The notes were denominated in German Reichsmark but could only be spent in an occupied country, not in Germany. German troops were paid in these notes, thus effectively forcing



the occupied nations to finance the cost of their occupation. The undated notes were used from 1940 to 1945 in German occupied Poland, Belgium, Denmark, Greece, France, Guernsey, Jersey, Luxembourg, Norway, the USSR, and Yugoslavia.

The **20 Reichsmark** depicts Albrecht Durer's "The Architect" and a small eagle and swastika on the front. The Brandenburg Gate is on the back. It has an embossed eagle & swastika seal.

The **5 Reichsmark** note depicts the head of farmer shouldering a scythe and the head of a worker shouldering a hammer on the front. The back depicts the Neue Wache building in Berlin. Originally built in 1816 as a guard house for the Prussian royal palace, since 1931 it has served as a war memorial and tomb of the unknown soldier.

The **1 and 2 Reichsmark** include detailed underprinting, guilloches and the denomination on the front and back. A faint swastika underprint is on the center front of the 1 Reichsmark

FIRST BANKNOTE ISSUED BY NAZI GERMANY



The 50 Reichsmark dated March 30, 1933 was the first banknote issued under the Nazi regime. It features the portrait and watermark of 19th century Prussian politician and banker David Hansemann. The back features a portrait of Mercury in a medallion flanked by two small children. The design does not include a swastika. The note is 170 x 85mm

FIRST BANKNOTES NAZI GERMAN OCCUPIED CROATIA & SERBIA



On April 6, 1941 Axis Forces under Nazi Germany invaded Yugoslavia. They promptly conquered and divided the nation along ethnic lines, creating the puppet governments for Croatia and Serbia. Other parts of Yugoslavia were divided between Italy, Bulgaria, Germany, Hungary and their client regimes. Croatia was nominally ruled by an Italian prince who never set foot in the country. Serbia directly controlled by the German military. Yugoslavia was reunited after World War II under communist rule. Ironically, after the collapse of communism in 1991, it again broke-up along ethnic lines.

From **Croatia** we have the first notes issued by the Nazi puppet state, the 100 and 500 Kuna dated May 26, 1941, just seven weeks after the invasion. The 100 Kuna features the Croatian coat of arms and is 150 x 80mm. The 500 Kuna three sheaves of wheat and is 160 x 84mm. The notes were printed in Germany Giesecke & Devrient, a private company which is still a major banknote printer.

From **Serbia** we have the overprinted 100 Dinara note dated May 1, 1941. After invading Yugoslavia, the Germans found a large quantity of the beautiful 1929 Yugoslavian 100 Dinara banknotes in the vaults of the Central Bank. The front of the notes picture a seated woman holding a sword overlooking a village on a bay. The back pictured sailboats and a young man with fruit leaning on the arms of Yugoslavia. The Germans put an ugly brown overprint on what was one of the world's prettiest banknotes in an attempt to cover up all references to Yugoslavia. The note measures 172 x 101mm.

Old South American Tokens

OLD CHILEAN VULCANITE NITRATE MINE TOKENS



Chile's Atacama Desert was once a major source of nitrates, which was an important ingredient in gunpowder and fertilizer. These vulcanite tokens were issued by Chilean nitrate mining company to pay their workers. The pay was good, up to 4 pesos per day for a boy, 12 pesos per day for a man, far higher than could be earned farming. However, conditions were harsh: 12-hour work days under dry, dusty, noisy conditions with scorching hot days and freezing nights. And pay was usually in the form of tokens which could only be used at the high-priced company store. Only rarely could they be exchanged for Chilean currency. Tokens were made of vulcanite, a durable form of hard rubber, because the harsh environment destroyed metal tokens (the companies did not care what it did to the miners). Tokens were made from the late 19th century until 1924, when Chile outlawed their use. The tokens come in a variety of shapes, colors and sizes from about 27mm to 46mm. Most are denominated 1 or 2 Pesos. The larger lots include tokens denominated "1 kilo de carne" (meat).

HISTORIC URUGUAY RANCH TOKENS



In the 19th and early 20th Century cattle ranches in Uruguay issued tokens to pay workers. Of course, they could only be used at the ranch's pulperia, which was a general store and bar. To assist ranchers who could not afford have their own tokens minted,

Uruguay issued generic tokens on which ranches could stamp their own brand. One side has the legend "REPUBLICA ORIENTAL DEL URUGUAY" and the denomination. The other side has the legend "ESTABLECIMIENTO DE GANADERIA" (Livestock Farm) and an area in the center for the ranch's brand. Sometimes a ranch would overstamp the denomination with their brand as well. We have these historic generic Uruguay aluminum tokens with an elaborate XX brand.

DISPUTED ARUNACHAL PRADESH



Arunachal Pradesh is a territory in northeastern India controlled by India but claimed by China. In 1962 Chinese forces captured most of Arunachal Pradesh, but after declaring victory, returned control to India. In addition, there are insurgency forces that want to incorporate it into an independent Nagaland. Access to

the region is severely restricted. The unofficial 2025 Arunachal Pradesh 1000 Rupee coin has the coat of arms on one side and Snow Leopard on the other. The six sided 39mm silver plated Proof coin has a mintage of only 115 pieces.

DISPUTED OGADEN

Ogaden is the eastern portion of Ethiopia, surrounded on two sides by Somalia. Most of its inhabitants are Muslim Somalis. Conflict over control of the area between Ethiopia and the Somalis has been going on for centuries. Both sides have been indiscriminate in their attacks and killings. The obverse of this unofficial 2025 Ogaden 1000 Lacag features the Ogaden coat of arms. The reverse depicts a warrior with a bow and arrow and the head of a lion. The 39mm silver-plated Proof coin has a scalloped edge. Only 115 pieces were minted.

COIBA COIN FEATURES WILDLIFE



Coiba is an island off the western coast of Panama. The original inhabitants were enslaved by the Spanish in 1560. Panama operated brutal prison on the island from 1919 until 2004. Now Coiba and nearby islands are a national park. Because they were separated from the mainland 12,000 to 18,000 years ago, they are the home

of many endemic subspecies which are only found on the islands. The obverse of this unofficial 2025 Coiba 5 Pesto coin features a dolphin, a stingray and the Panamanian coat of arms. The reverse depicts Scarlet Macaws. The eight sided, 40mm, silver-plated brass coin has a mintage of only 110 pieces.

ANCIENT GREEK SHIP ON COIN OF ICARIA



Icaria is a Greek island in the eastern Aegean Sea. It takes its name from the mythological character Icarus who is said to have been buried there after flying too close to the sun. The island became an Ottoman possession in 1521 but the Ottomans did not even bother to collect taxes there for several centuries. In 1827 during the Greek

War of Independence, Icaria seceded from the Ottoman Empire, but was not included in the original Greek territory, so was forced to again accept Ottoman rule. In July 1912 the residents expelled the Ottoman garrison and declared independence. For five months, it remained an independent country, with its own government, armed forces, flag and postage stamps. Faced with food shortages and economic difficulties, it officially joined Greece in November 1912. The unofficial 2025 Icaria 500 Drachmas depicts Icarus on the obverse and an ancient Greek Trireme on the reverse. The six-sided, 39mm silver-plated Proof coin has a mintage of only 120 pieces.

KNIGHT ON COIN OF KLODZKO LAND



Klodzko Land is an area of Poland located on the Czech border. It was a center of rivalry between Bohemia and Poland in the Middle Ages. It later became a Hapsburg possession. During the Thirty Years' War it was the center of a Protestant revolt. Prussia conquered the region in the First Silesian War and it remained part of Germany until

after World War II when it was given to Poland - over the objections of Czechoslovakia. It is the home of many historic buildings and churches. One of the more unusual is the Skull Chapel, a church entirely decorated thousands of human skulls and bones. The chapel was built in 1776 utilizing bones from the mass graves of people who died of disease and in the many wars that had rocked the region. The obverse of this unofficial 2025 Klodzko Land 50 Zlotych features a crowned regal lion and coat of arms. The reverse depicts a king and a knight on horseback. The eight-sided, 40mm, silver plated Proof coin has a mintage of only 120 pieces.

RARE KURDISTAN 2006 1000 DINAR COIN

This Kurdistan 2006 dated 1000 Dinar pictures Mustafa Barzani, a charismatic Kurdish nationalist leader. He spent his entire life fighting for Kurdish independence. When he was only three years old he and his family were imprisoned by the Ottomans for an insurrection by his tribe. Much of his family was later executed. After the British gained control of Iraq following World War I he engaged in attacks against both British and Iraqi authorities. In 1946 he led a Kurdish revolt against Iraq. He died in 1979 in the United States. The reverse of the coin features the Kurdish mountain emblem, representing the Kurds of Iraq, Turkey and Syria. The unofficial 27mm coin is struck in brass-plated zinc and has a mintage of 8,500 pieces.

ISLA GORGONA COIN FEATURES HAMMERHEAD SHARK AND COATI



Isla Gorgona is a Colombian possession located 17 miles (28km) off its coast. The island was named after the mythical Gorgon Medusa by conquistador Francisco Pizarro who fled there in 1527 to escape from attacking Indians. More than half of his men died of poisonous snake bites in the seven months he inhabited the island. Later the

island served as a stopover for pirates and ships traveling between Panama to Peru due to its abundance of fresh water and good timber. From 1959 until 1984 it served as a brutal maximum-security prison for Columbia's worst criminals. It was turned into a national park after the closure of the prison. The obverse of this unofficial 2025 Isla Gorgona 50,000 Pesos coin depicts a Hammerhead shark. A Coati is on the reverse. The 39mm silver-plated Proof coin has a scalloped edge. Only 110 pieces were minted.

THE LOST TREASURES OF COCO



Isla del Coco is a remote jungle island in the Pacific. It is administered by Costa Rica as a National Park. Its only inhabitants are rangers who are temporarily assigned there. It has long been rumored to be the hiding place of great treasures, including Incan treasures, treasures raided from Spanish galleons, the Treasure of Lima stolen from the Spanish by an

English sea captain in 1820 and treasures hidden by various pirates who briefly inhabited the island in the 19th century. Hundreds of attempts have been made to discover the buried riches, but so far only a few gold coins and some jewels have been discovered. Today treasure hunting is prohibited on the island. This unofficial 2025 Isla del Coco 250 Piastros features a pirate ship, the Jolly Roger and the Costa Rican coat of arms on the obverse. The reverse depicts a Virginia Deer, a species that was probably introduced in the 19th century. The eight-sided, silver-plated Proof coin has a mintage of just 110 pieces.

NIGER SILVER ABOLITION OF SLAVERY PATTERN COIN



This 2007 unofficial 2500 Franc pattern was issued for Niger to commemorate the 100th Anniversary of Great Britain outlawing slavery. The obverse depicts John Brown. Brown was a radical American abolitionist who led several violent anti-slavery confrontations in Bleeding Kansas uprisings in the late 1850's. In 1859 he led a raid on the Federal Amory in Harper's Ferry, Virginia hoping to spark a

widespread slave revolt. He was captured and hanged. The arms of Niger is on the reverse. The 27.3mm coin is 1/4 troy ounce of .999 silver and has a mintage of only 850 pieces.

FLEMISH BI-METALLIC EURO COIN

Belgium is divided linguistically and culturally between the Flemish (Dutch) speaking north (Flanders) and the French speaking south (Walloons). This leads to political friction. Many in the north advocate for an independent Flanders. The obverse of this unofficial 2010 bi-metallic Flemish Republic 1 Euro depicts the Flemish lion. The date June 13, 2010 is the date the election was won by a Flemish pro-independence party, resulting in Belgium taking almost a full year to form a new government. The reverse includes a map of Flanders with the legend Vlaams Euro (Flemish Euro).

Goldback Aurum notes are a voluntary local currency made of 24 karat gold! Each wafer-thin note is coated with a protective plastic coating so it can be circulated without the gold tearing. They are issued in increments of 1/1000 troy ounce of gold in order to allow for small purchases. 1 Goldback is 1/1000 troy ounce of gold. The 1 Goldback note is approximately 66x117mm. The notes are printed on one side only, with intricate multi-color allegorical style designs,

The **1/2 Arizona Goldback** celebrates the virtue of Fides (Faith), honoring the Spanish missionaries. The design features a young woman and two white doves in front of the famed Mission San Xavier del Bac, founded in 1692

The **1 Arizona Goldback** represents Temperantia (Temperance). It depicts a woman in front of Mission San Jose de Tumacacori representing the era following Mexico's independence from Spain.

The **2 Arizona Goldback** embodies Exploratio (Exploration) through a vivid tribute to the 1869 Powell Geographic Expedition - the first recorded journey through the Grand Canyon by boat.

The **5 Arizona Goldback** depicts *Lex et Ordo* (Law and Order) through an homage to Tombstone's legendary 1881 gunfight at the O.K. Corral.

The **10 Arizona Goldback** celebrates *Virtus* (Valor). It depicts the courage and resilient Buffalo Soldiers of the 10th Cavalry Regiment stationed at Fort Huachuca.

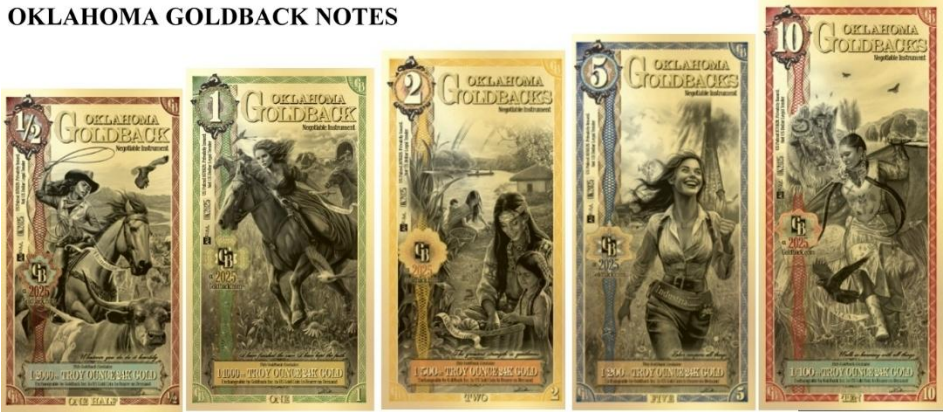

The **1 Oklahoma Goldback** honors *Perseverantia* (Perseverance) through a vivid depiction of the Land Run of 1889. A young pioneer woman charges forward on horseback, land stake in hand, driven by the promise of a new beginning. Surrounding her are symbols of resilience from native wildflowers to Oklahoma’s state bird, capturing the ambition that built entire towns from dust.

The **2 Oklahoma Goldback** features *Benevolentia*, (Kindness) through the gentle strength of Indigenous motherhood. A Cherokee woman in traditional dress carries a harvest basket filled with corn, beans, squash, and strawberries - symbols of life and renewal. Set in the fertile valleys of Tahlequah, this design honors matriarchs, generational wisdom, and the enduring bond between people and land.

The **5 Oklahoma Goldback** honors *Industria* (Industry) through the story of the Glenpool Oil Strike of 1905. A young woman walks the oil fields with purpose, her tool belt marked “1905” and her expression filled with pride. Bees hover nearby, symbolizing teamwork and transformation. The image reflects Oklahoma’s rise from farmland to energy powerhouse.

The **10 Oklahoma Goldback** celebrates *Unitas* (Unity) through the vibrant tradition of an intertribal powwow. A woman performs the Fancy Shawl Dance while a male dancer moves behind her in a whirlwind of color and rhythm. Surrounded by hummingbirds, butterflies, and buffalo, this scene honors Oklahoma’s deep Indigenous heritage.

GIBRALTAR RECREATES OLD BANKNOTE

To commemorate World Tourism in 2018 the Government of Gibraltar created an official replica of the 10 Shilling note of 1934. The note was sold by the Gibraltar Philatelic Bureau for £2.50. It could be redeemed for 50 Pence (the equivalent of 10 Shillings) in 2018. The front features the Rock of Gibraltar. The arms of Gibraltar featuring a castle is on the back. The note is 130 × 75 mm. It is an attractive and the least expensive Gibraltar banknote.

NAMIBIA 60 DOLLAR BANKNOTE HONORS PRESIDENT'S 60 YEARS OF SERVICE



In 2025 Namibia issued a polymer 60 Dollar note honoring Dr. Hage Gottfried Geingob, who died in 2024. The

60 Dollar note commemorates his 60 years of "service and steadfast dedication to Namibia's democracy, economic progress, and social inclusion". He was country's first prime minister from 1990 to 2002, and again from 2012 to 2015. He was the Minister of Trade and Industry from 2008 until 2012 and President of Namibia from 2015 until his death in 2024. The front of the note features his portrait. Behind him is the 1990 Constituent Assembly that drafted Namibia's constitution. Also included is a SPARK image of the Bank of Namibia logo and two clear windows, one featuring the facade of the Independence Memorial Museum in Windhoek, the other features the Geingob's face and the number "60". To assist the blind there is a circle of raised dots at the upper right. Geingob was an avid soccer fan, so the back features him holding a soccer trophy. Also on the back are wind turbines, a hydrogen tank, biomass and solar panels.

RECENT ESWATINI BANKNOTES



In 2018 Swaziland renamed itself Eswatini. The first banknote released bearing the new name was the 50 Emalangeni dated 2018 depicting the Central Bank building on the back. 10 and 20 Emalangeni notes were not released until 2024. The back of the 10 Emalangeni depicts 9 princesses dancing in the Incwala (kingship) ceremony. The month-long ceremony takes place in conjunction with the summer solstice. The back of the 20 Emalangeni includes a flower, corn, pineapple, steer and a refinery. All three notes feature the portrait and watermark of King Mswati III on the front.

KING CHARLES III ON NEW FALKLAND POLYMER 5 POUND NOTE



Falkland Islands released a new polymer 5 Pound note in 2025. The front includes King Charles III, a map of the Falklands, five

black-browed albatrosses in flight, the Falkland coat of arms and the legend "FIRST RECORDED SIGHTING OF THE FALKLAND ISLANDS /FROM THE EXPEDITION SHIP DESIRE, 14 AUGUST 1592". The legend supports Britain's claim to the Falklands, which are also claimed by Argentina. A triangle of raised dots are at the lower right to assist the blind. The back includes an image of a mountain on Steeple Jason Island a Pale Maiden flower, which is the national flower and five species of penguins. The note has a clear window depicting a penguin.

FATHER AND SON DICTATORS OF SYRIA



The Assad family brutally ruled Syria from 1970 until December 2024. Hafez al-Assad came to power in a coup d'etat in 1970. He consolidated power, gaining absolute control over the Syrian government and created a personality cult centered on himself and his family. He opened prison death camps and ruthlessly crushed any opposition. After his first son and expected successor Bassel died in an automobile crash in 1994, his second son, Bashar became his designated successor. Previously Bashar was considered somewhat of a geek, showing little interest in politics and was training in London to be an ophthalmologist. Bashar succeeded his father after his death in 2000. Many were hoping that with a British education, Bashar would be a reformist, but instead he was even more repressive. There was extensive secret police surveillance, heavy censorship and numerous summary executions. Perceived opponents were jailed and tortured. He was considered one of the most repressive regimes in modern times. In 2011 a multi-sided civil war broke out which continued until his fall in 2024. During the civil war Bashar engaged in chemical warfare, war crimes. In December 2024 his regime rapidly collapsed and Bashar fled to Russia during a major offensive by opposition groups.

Hafez al-Assad is depicted on the front of the 1997 Syrian 1000 Pound note along with the Great Mosque of Damascus, an ancient cuneiform tablet and an Umayyad gold Dinar. The back includes images of the oil industry, a cargo ship and a combine harvester. Bashar al-Asad is on the front of the 2021 2000 Pound note along with the Umayyad Mosque in Damascus. The denomination is micro-perforated at the right. The back shows the interior of the Parliament building. It is an attractive pair of notes depicting a ruthless but short dynasty.
